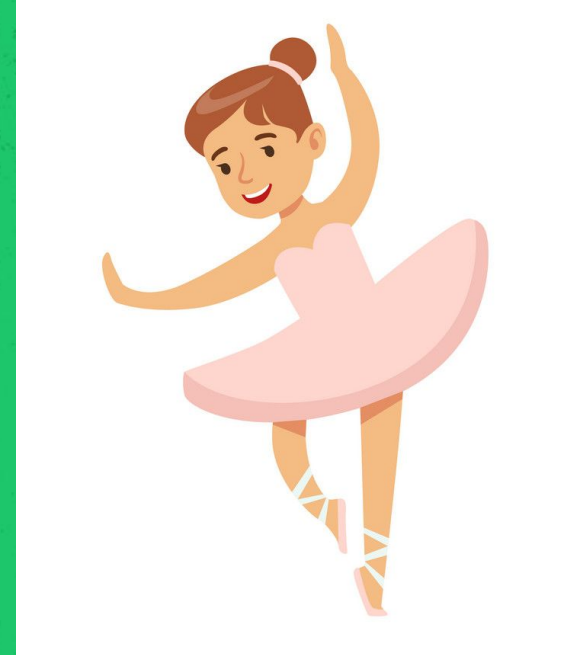
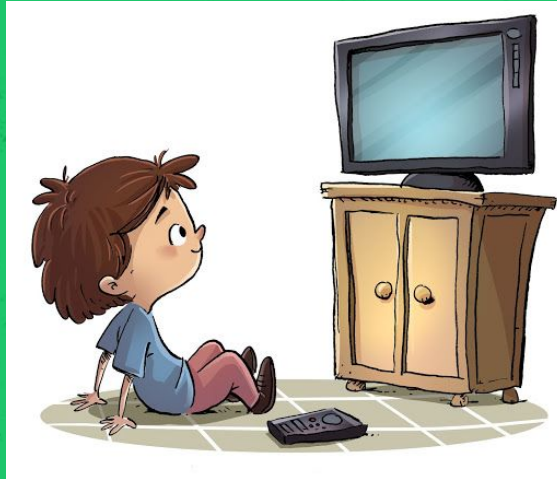

Judy's life

She graduated four years later and found a job at a local bakery near her house.

With their salaries, they bought an adorable cottage to live together. Two years later, Judy and Stefano had a baby. Judy worked at the bakery her whole life, and recently retired. Just last month, she celebrated her 91st birthday next to Stefano, her daughter and grandchildren!

Grammar: WHO Questions in Simple Past

WHO Questions can have two different structures: with or without the auxiliary verb DID

**WITH
DID:**

Who **did** you meet yesterday?

I met Angela yesterday

The main verb appears
in infinitive (base form)

The main verb appears
in Simple Past

**WITHOUT
DID:**

Who organized the party?

Angela organized the party



Grammar: WHO Questions in Simple Past

**WITH
DID:**

In complete answers: ¹ Pronoun + ² main verb + ³ person (WHO) + ⁴ complement

Who did you meet yesterday?

I met Angela yesterday

¹ I ² met ³ Angela ⁴ yesterday



**WITHOUT
DID:**

In complete answers: ¹ Person (WHO) + ² main verb + ³ complement

Who organized the party?

Angela organized the party

¹ Angela ² organized ³ the party

Grammar: WHO Questions in Simple Past

Questions with did are called OBJECT QUESTIONS

Who did you meet yesterday?

I met Angela yesterday.



Questions without did are called SUBJECT QUESTIONS

Who organized the party?

Angela organized the party.

Grammar: WHO Questions in Simple Past

WHO Questions without did

Person + did



Instead of complete answers, we can also give short answers:

- ✓ Who organized the party? **Angela did.** (she did)
- ✓ Who cooked this meat? **Frank did.** (he did)
- ✓ Who cleaned the floor? **Joe and Paula did.** (they did)
- ✓ Who wrote this text? **I did.**
